

## ACTC Criminal Justice On-Campus Dual Credit

CTE Dual Credit Students must meet:

- o An ACT Composite Score of 16;
- o OR ACT Mathematics 16 AND ACT Reading 16;
- o OR any accepted equivalent from the KCTCS Assessment and Placement Policy;
- o OR a high school grade point average (GPA) of 2.5;
- o AND any course-specific requirements noted in the KCTCS course catalog. See below.

### Criminal Justice Dual Credit Opportunities 2021-2022

#### On College Drive Campus or Online, depending upon availability

These two classes are the first of five total that comprise the Criminal Justice Core Certificate. The other three are CRJ 216 (Criminal Law), CRJ 217 (Criminal Procedures), and CRJ 204 (Criminal Investigations-must be in person). These would be open to vetted juniors and seniors; limited seating is based on first come, first serve. Face to face is preferable if students can get to campus, however these are offered online as well.

- Indicate from prior academic performance the ability to handle large amounts of reading, writing, and independent learning to handle online or face to face coursework.
- Exhibit excellent maturity, attendance, and punctuality. Meet CTE placement requirements (general education course requirements are recommended, however, due to the amount of reading and writing required)
